

# ART MUSEUM SCHOLAR SUMMER INTERNSHIPS

Art Museum Scholar Summer Internships will provide funds for four undergraduate Yale students to participate in summer internships at the Yale University Art Gallery, the Yale Center for British Art, or other art museums. Art Museum Summer Scholar Interns will receive a stipend of up to \$3,000. Internships must be eight weeks.

At least one of the four internships is to be held at the Yale University Art Gallery and one at the Yale Center for British Art. The internships at the Gallery and the Center will familiarize students with the operation of museums and curatorial departments and will provide an opportunity to work on a project related to a specific aspect of the museum's collection. Students seeking opportunities with other art museums must procure such internships on their own. Although the awards are open to students in any field, preference will be given to Yale students whose interests lie in American art and/or British art. The four internships are named as follows:

Helen A. Cooper Scholar of American Art  
Patricia E. Kane Scholar of American Art  
Patrick McCaughey Scholar of British Art  
Duncan Robinson Scholar of British Art

Internships will be awarded to students who demonstrate superior performance in their respective fields. Applications for the internship must include a cover letter describing the student's interest in a particular aspect of the museum's collection or operations and the relevance of the internship to the student's larger goals, an official transcript of

the student's undergraduate record, and two letters of recommendation. If the student is seeking funding for an internship at an art museum other than the Yale University Art Gallery or the Yale Center for British Art, the cover letter should describe the internship and the status of the student's application. A letter confirming a secured internship will also be required.

All candidates applying for jobs at the Yale University Art Gallery or Yale Center for British Art will be subject to pre-employment screening. All offers are contingent upon the successful completion of a background check.
